Alcohol in Africa

SDG - Sustainable Development Goals - put together by the United Nations. There are 17 of them and alcohol is a massive obstacle to achieving 13 of them. Alcohol is an obstacle to development by jeopardising human capital and hindering sustainable human development.

Ghana - Women who had ever consumed alcohol, frequent alcohol users, and even occasional alcohol users were about three times as likely to die from abortion-related causes compared to those who abstained from alcohol.

South Africa - 65% of women experiencing intimate partner violence report the perpetrator had used alcohol.

Botswana - focus groups in rural areas show that women who are victims of domestic violence rank alcohol as a number one factor.
